

In 2021/2022 we were grateful to reach a more "normal" state of affairs and were able to offer the full range of services to our patrons.

We hosted some special activities this year such as a tiny art show of patron painted canvases, our first ever seed library and our tiny pumpkin painting exhibit. Patrons enthusiastically participated in these activities with impressive results.

Our Children's Storytime and craft classes returned to in-person events and we added several new teen clubs. Teens have been enjoying the board game club, the video game club and the book club.

We've earmarked funds for capital improvements to enhance the safety and longevity of our building. We will be upgrading our roof, our restrooms and our parking lot. Besides regular maintenance, we had two large damaged trees removed from the library property. We also added a nice picnic table in a shady spot on library grounds for community members as well as staff to use, a donation from our Friends' group.

We've continued to fill our calendar with interesting and innovative programming. A special program this year was a Chalk Art program with David Zinn, and patrons filled the library sidewalks with unique and colorful drawings.

Our investment accounts proved disappointing this year as a result of current economic conditions, but we remain on solid financial footing due to many years of wise planning by our Library Board. We continue to make careful choices with the resources we manage.
