# **Mobile Hotspots**

You can now borrow the Internet by checking out one of our Mobile Hotspots. It is a small device that people can use to wirelessly connect their mobile devices or laptops to the Internet.

Multiple users can connect their devices simultaneously to use the free WiFi. You could take it on vacation in a remote area or

use in areas of the house where service is spotty.

Any patron over 18 with a TDL

card in good standing can check out one of the devices. They circulate for two weeks and cannot be renewed. A fee of \$5 per day will be charged for late returns. The hotspot must be returned inside the Library to a staff

> member and not in the book drop or a charge will be assessed. They can be reserved just like books.

Learning a new language is fun and easy. With over 70 languages to choose from, Mango Languages creates an enjoyable learning experience for users of all ages. Happy learners around the globe have used Mango to experience new languages, connect with new cultures and broaden their horizons.

TDL card holders can create a Mango account by using their library card. Patrons can learn from a desktop computer or download the Mango app to their mobile devices.

Mango focuses on four key elements of language learning:



vocabulary, pronunciation, grammar and culture. Courses are intuitive and user-friendly, designed with an appreciation of culture and real world applications. Pronunciation helpers and voice comparison technology also allow students to perfect their accents as they go. Audio can be adjusted to a slower, articulate level or a faster pace.

### iPod Shuffle Available for Checkout

TDL now has an iPod Shuffle available to checkout. It is attached to a small speaker, so earbuds or headphones aren't necessary. The iPod is easy to use—even those with mobility issues should have no trouble operating it.

The first iPod is loaded with over 100 hymns and future iPods

will have music from the 1950's, 60's and 70's—we have 3 more in the works. It will circulate for two weeks and must be returned inside the Library at the Circulation Desk.

You can reserve the iPod just like a book. Consider this for elderly listeners as it is very simple technology.

We do not determine the value of the donation. Receipts are available upon request.


## Need a Notary Public?

Types of documents that may require notarization include wills, trusts, deeds, contracts and affidavits.


Cost for this service is \$1 per document for card holders and \$2 per document for non-card holders.

Appointments are always encouraged but not necessary.


