Library App

Library Cards

TDL issues Resident and Non-Resident library cards to all patrons depending on the following criteria:

Resident Card

TDL is proud to serve residents of the City of Tecumseh and portions of Adrian, Franklin, Macon, Raisin, Ridgeway and Tecumseh Townships. Residents in these communities must complete a registration form and present proof of residency to receive a TDL card. A Resident Card is valid for two years.

Non-Resident Card

Patrons residing outside the TDL service area may obtain a Non-Resident Card at a rate determined by the TDL Board of Trustees. The current price of a Non-Resident Card valid for one year is \$50. A Non-Resident Card valid for 6 months is \$25.

Business Card

Patrons who own a business or work for a business within the TDL service area may obtain a Business Card free of charge. A Business Card is valid for one year.

Teen Cards

Teens aged 16–17 years old may obtain a Teen Library Card. Teens must show a driver's license, State ID, or proof of residency. This card can be converted to a regular card with a parent's signature and proof of residency. This is a limited card with a maximum check-out of two items.

Cards for Minors

Youth under the age of 18 years will be issued their own Resident or Non-Resident Library Card when the parent or guardian signs a registration form and assumes financial responsibility. Only those designated on the registration form have access to the youth's borrowing record.
