Did you know we have a new digital card for all students at Tecumseh Public Schools? The card allows any student at TPS to access our digital resources, such as Overdrive/Libby, hoopla, MEL databases, America's News, Mango Languages, Tutor.com and more. To register for a digital card go to our website www.tecumsehlibrary.org and click on the Programs/Events tab. It will take you to where you can sign up, using your name and TPS email. (Note: if you already have a card at Tecumseh District Library, you already have access to our digital resources and won't need this one.)

Students, of all ages, should check out our new Tutor.com resource. From 2 pm to 9 pm online tutors are available to help with subject areas, to review papers, to assist with math problems and to help with resume/cover letters. If you need some assistance, consider this free online resource.

Teens have a new program just for them – Teen Book Boxes! Any teen with a library card can register for this fun program. Once a month, registered teens pick up a box containing a book selected by our Teen librarian and checked out to the teen, plus some treats to keep. The book and the box are returned through the book drop and the teen registers for the next month.




Need Some Indoor Exercise?
