

His manga style relies on an interesting mix of body horror and cosmic horror to create some really insane illustrations. 


colleagues, however, are not convinced at all. Can Emily amass enough evidence and change their minds in time before more lives are lost?


Title: The Language of Flowers Author: Vanessa Diffenbaugh Fiction

Kathy Title: An Elderly Lady is Up to No Good Author: Helene Tursten Fiction



A global conflict on Earth has left society divided into color-coded tiers, with the lowest classes serving the upper classes in territories throughout space. The story follows a young man in the lowest class, the 'Reds,' who works in the mines on Mars until

something happens that drives him to infiltrate high society and destroy it from the inside. I love this book because the author does an incredible job at taking real current and past events and creating a fictional future that is believable, with enough familiarity that it isn't overwhelming. The plot is fast-paced and exciting, with plenty of action. It has really cool references to mythology, and the characters are complex, each with their own depth and development. I would absolutely recommend this to anyone who enjoys things like *The Hunger Games, Ender's Game*, or *Lord of the Flies*.

See what happens when his actual apprenticeship with the Rangers, with their mottled cloaks and mysterious ways, leads him into an epic adventure with heroes, villains and wonderful friendships. A fabulous coming of age

story with the least-likely characters saving the day - regardless of gender, age, experience - using their own practical know-how and the strength of their friendships. Flanagan has created a wholly believable world peopled with rich characters and excellent challenges. I didn't expect to like this book when I first picked it up (National Book Day, 2012), but have been a huge fan of the series and the author ever since.





Title: **Beneath a Scarlet Sky** Author: **Mark T. Sullivan** Historical Fiction






Kaya Title: Stormbreaker (Alex Rider series, Book 1) Author: Anthony Horowitz YA Adventure Fiction

A fiction series for young adults, Alex Rider is an exciting story about a young man who is recruited by MI6 and becomes involved in dangerous and thrilling adventures. Cinder is a gifted mechanic who is part cyborg due to a horrific accident in her mysterious past. She is considered a second-class citizen and is reviled by her step-

mother.

Prince Kai and Cinder meet at the marketplace while she repairs his personal robot and Cinder suddenly finds herself at the center of an intergalactic struggle with a forbidden love interest. She must uncover her past, find out why the Lunar Queen wants her dead, and save both the Earth's and the Lunar future.

Non-stop excitement! First story in a quartet with an extra novella thrown in.




Melissa Title: **Olive, Again** Author: **Elizabeth Strout** Fiction



The cult has assembled a group of men with supernatural powers, each of whom is given a young girl to marry in exchange for one of their own daughters. Charlie and Wyrick head to the cult's headquarters and, with the

help of the FBI, attempt to infiltrate and release the children from captivity.

This is a fast-moving story with lots of twists and turns and was nearly impossible to put down!

Historical Fiction



Kathy Title: Heart-Shaped Box Author: Joe Hill Horror/Suspense/Thriller

An aging death-metal rock god, Judas Coyne, is a collector of the macabre: a cookbook for cannibals... a used hangman's noose... a snuff film. But nothing he possesses is as unlikely or as dreadful as an item he learns is for sale on the Internet. For a thousand dollars, Jude will become the proud owner of a dead man's suit, said to be haunted by


the deceased's restless spirit. Judas has spent a lifetime coping with ghosts - of an abusive father, of the lovers he callously abandoned, of the bandmates he betrayed - so what's one more? Truly creepy...I loved it!



Kaya Title: Sharp Objects Author: Gillian Flynn Psychological Mystery

A great read about a reporter who must return to her hometown to cover the murders of two young girls. Recently discharged from a psych hospital, the main character Camille Preaker is facing her own demons, made worse as she returns to a dysfunctional home within a disturbing town.

Gillian Flynn has a way of making even mundane things like weather feel disturbing and unsettled that creates a chilling tone, and her plot kept me guessing until the very end. Check the trigger warnings before reading, though.


Title: **The Boy in the Striped Pajamas** Author: **John Boyner** YA Historical Fiction

This is a riveting introduction to the atrocities of the Holocaust for young adults.

The story follows a young German boy who lives a happy, privileged life in Berlin in 1942. His high ranking military father gets a promotion and the family moves far away to a new home where there are no other children to play with and nothing to do.

The only thing in his landscape is a tall, tall fence that goes on as far as he can see. It cuts him off from strange looking people, including a skinny boy in striped pajamas. The two young boys become best friends which leads to horrible consequences for both boys.

I found the juxtaposition of innocence and evil so disturbing that I remember details of this work more than 15 years after I read this book. Outstanding!



Melissa Title: Delicious! Author: Ruth Reichl Fiction


Billie Breslin has moved from home and family in California to New York to work at Delicious! - NY's renowned food magazine. Homesick and missing her older sister, she just begins to find a new family in the quirky, well-meaning magazine staff and the ebullient and welcoming food vendors, when the magazine is suddenly closed. Billie is offered the chance to continue to work at the empty office running the

reader's complaint hotline (while working part-time at the most WONDERFUL Italian food store), so she can remain in NY and pay her bills.

While working in her new capacity, Billie explores the old office building and discovers letters written from 12-year-old Lulu to James Beard (yes, the great chef) during WW II. The letters bring to life history through the eyes of a resourceful young girl and the then young famous foodie during a period of fear, deprivation and hardship. The intertwining of the historical narrative with the modern-day (often random and ridiculous) complaints from the hotline against a rich tableau of food and flavor, provides Billie the chance to finally come to terms with her own fears and to recognize her innermost strengths and desires.

Whenever I need to laugh, cry, laugh, salivate over wonderful food, and come away feeling the better for taking the time, I re-read this book. It is truly one of my all-time favorites and is well-worn and much loved. Ruth Reichl is a gem of a writer and her books are food for the heart and mind.



A children's book about book banning and what happens when books are challenged. However, when Donovan's mother reads it, she doesn't think it's suitable for children and asks the school




Christina Title: Blind Faith (The Jigsaw Files, no. 3) Author: Sharon Sala

Another fast-moving nail-biter that will bring you through the whole spectrum of emotions right to the very end.



Title: **My Grandmother Asked Me to Tell You She's Sorry** Author: **Fredrik Backman** Fiction



A little mystery...a little spooky....but mostly an excellent coming-of-age story.




Kaya Title: Verity Author: Colleen Hoover Thiller/Suspense Fiction



Title: Gregor the Overlander (The Underland Chronicles Series, no.1) Author: Suzanne Collins Juvenile Fantasy

These stories are about a boy who embarks on a dangerous quest to fulfill his destiny in a strange and exciting world beneath New York City. The tale begins with a laundry room grate, where Gregor drops through in order to save his little sister. They fall, like Alice in Wonderland, into the dark Underland where giant spiders, bats, cockroaches, and rats coexist with humans.

This was Suzanne Collins debut novel for 8 to 12 year olds, before THE HUNGER GAMES series. She started her career as a TV writer and this series has visually fantastical world building along with full character development.

Don't miss this tale of family love, adventure, and suspense! There's loads of subtle humor....I love that she made the giant cockroaches lovable.



Melissa Title: The Shell Seekers

Author: **Rosamunde Pilcher** Realistic Fiction

This classic book by one of my favorite authors cemented my love for Porthkerris (Cornwall) and the Keeling family. An amazing family saga, it's told from a multiplicity of views and beautifully intertwines the history of the main character/family grande dame Penelope with that of her past and present family. *The Shell Seekers* is actually the title to a famous painting by Penelope's father, one that she holds dear. Encompassing three

generations, the story begins in the wake of Penelope's unexpected health crisis opening the door to a chain of remembrances - from her bohemian (often unconventional) childhood, her WWII romance and ensuing events, to present day familial struggles and final culmination in an impromptu trip to the place of fondest memory.

Filled with heartfelt emotion, the book explores the secrets, desires, and misfortunes of the Keelings (et al.) and will keep you up late turning pages as you live vicariously through their experiences. A MUST READ!




