

Title: **The End of Your Life Book Club** Author: **Will Schwalbe** Non-Fiction/Biography/Memoir



Bri Title: A Spoonful of Frogs Author: Casey Lyall Illustrator: Vera Brosgol Children's Picture Book




excellent "whodunit?"!





Title: **Gustavo the Shy Ghost** Author/Illustrator: **Flavia Z. Drago** Children's Picture Book



something sinister is being hidden right in their own backyard. With Addie's help, Jack fights to reveal the truth and prove his innocence.




lived with gusto and love.



Title: Etiquette & Espionage (Book the One) Author: Gail Carriger YA Science Fiction/Adventure

Sophronia (a tomboy & aspiring mechanical engineer) is being packed off to Mademoiselle Geraldine's Finishing Academy for Young Ladies of Quality as a last resort. What her mother doesn't know is that in addition to gaining the polish 1851 English society demands, Sophronia will be learning "polite" methods of dealing death, utilizing diversionary tactics, and the "art" of chatter to elicit secrets and spread

misinformation. A humorous and titillating twist on a female's place in the world showing that by using the systems in place, she can subvert them from the inside to her advantage. A truly engaging romp for "girls" of all ages!

Title: **The Hobbit** Author: **J.R.R. Tolkein** Fantasy Fiction

"In a hole in the ground there lived a hobbit. Not a nasty, dirty, wet hole, filled with the ends of worms and an oozy smell, nor yet a dry, bare, sandy hole with nothing in it to sit down on or to eat: it was a hobbit-hole, and that means comfort." Written for J.R.R. Tolkien's own children, *The Hobbit* met with instant critical acclaim when it was

first published in 1937. Now recognized as a timeless classic, this introduction to the hobbit Bilbo Baggins, the wizard Gandalf, Gollum, and the spectacular world of Middle-earth recounts of the adventures of a reluctant hero, a powerful and dangerous ring, and the cruel dragon Smaug the Magnificent.
