INTRODUCTION

The Wareham Free Library Board of Trustees and Staff are pleased to present the library's Long Range Plan for FY 2025 through FY 2029. The plan provides the library with a strong framework to meet the needs of the Wareham Community. This plan is based on the responses from our community survey, completed by 107 people. Two community meetings were also held with library stakeholders (trustees, friends and foundation members), residents and library users, taking part in a SOARS (Strengths, Opportunities, Aspirations, and Results) activity.

Library staff also conducted their own SOARS analysis and developed strategies and activities for achieving the goals set forth in this long range plan.

The library worked with Jessica Ellis Wilson, FACMPE of Practical Management and Leadership Consulting. She facilitated, gathered, and organized all data resulting from the community and staff sessions.

Standards of Library Service

The legal requirements for state aid to libraries in Massachusetts provide the minimum standards for library service. (Code of Massachusetts Regulations 4.00: Free Public Library Service – Regulations.) The Wareham Free Library currently meets and strives to continue to meet these requirements.

- The library is open to everyone with no charge for normal services.
- The Wareham Free Library is currently open six days a week (closed Saturdays during the summer months of July and August). The library is open 50 hours per week, Monday and Thursday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Tuesday and Wednesday from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m., and Friday and Saturday from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.
 - (605 CMR 4.01: Regulations 3: Recommended Minimum Hours Open Per Week for libraries in communities with a population of 15,000 to 24,999 – 50 hours per week, including some part of five days, including some evening hours; hours requirement based on hours from Labor Day to Memorial Day, summer hours do not affect compliance.)
- The library employs trained library personnel including a Director with a degree from an approved graduate school of library science and a certificate of professional librarianship issued by the Massachusetts Board of Library Commissioners. The Director, Patrick Marshall, has a Masters of Library and Information Science from The University of Rhode Island and a Certificate of Librarianship from the Massachusetts Board of Library Commissioners, # P5064
 - (605 CMR 4.01: Regulations 4; Libraries in communities with population 10,000 and up.)
- In each of the last three fiscal years, the library has spent just over 15% of its budget on books and other library materials thus meeting, and at times exceeding, the 15% requirement.
 - (605 CMR 4.01: Regulations 5: Libraries in communities with population 15,000 to 24,999 shall spend a minimum percentage (15%) of the library's total annual budget for books and periodicals)
- The library lends books to other libraries in the Commonwealth and extends privileges to the holders of cards issued by other certified public libraries in the Commonwealth on a reciprocal basis.

Mission Statement

The Wareham Free Library provides a comfortable and welcoming place that stimulates people's imaginations, creates young readers, and connects residents to the world.

Vision Statement

The Wareham Free Library is a vital community hub where people and ideas come together. The library sustains itself through excellent customer service, careful stewardship of financial and physical resources, and attention to the ever changing needs of the community.

Strategic Priorities

Comfortable and Welcoming Place – We are a place for the entire community to feel welcome and connected. A safe space for sharing information and offering resources that provide clarity and balanced information supporting the inherent dignity and rights of every person.

Stimulates People's Imagination – We are a place that, through the breadth and depth of our collection, programs, and services, ignite curiosity and introduce residents to the wider world.

Creates Young Readers – We are a place that believes in encouraging children of all ages to become lifelong readers and learners.

Connects Residents to the World – We are a place that links our residents, either in person or online, to the greater world beyond.

These priorities evolved from the feedback we received from our planning process and are informed by our library Mission and Vision.

Annually, we will develop specific actions for each area of library service that address the strategic goals outlined in this plan.

The next few pages present more information about each strategic priority along with goals and possible activities.

Comfortable and Welcoming Place -

We are a place for the entire community to feel welcome and connected. A safe space for sharing information and offering resources that provide clarity and balanced information supporting the inherent dignity and rights of every person.

Residents of Wareham love their library and community. Feedback from our planning process showed that visitors to the library found the staff extremely helpful and friendly, and that visits to the facility were generally viewed positively. One area of concern repeatedly mentioned was the physical upkeep of the building.

Our activities in this area will allow us to further make the library a true community center for residents of, and visitors to, Wareham.

- GOAL 1. We strive to keep the building clean and welcoming for all users.
 Possible Activity 1: Evaluate furnishings in library and review where items can be replaced and/or rearranged to better meet the needs of library users.
 Possible Activity 2: Working with Municipal Maintenance Department, devise a plan to provide better lighting in the library, especially in study and reading areas.
 Possible Activity 3: Working with Municipal Maintenance Department and Town Administration, develop capital improvement plan for library.
- GOAL 2. Review library policies and establish a schedule for updating, as needed.
 Possible Activity 1: Staff will review current policies and see where updates are needed.
 Possible Activity 2: Evaluate areas where policies do not currently exist and create, as needed.

GOAL 3. Encourage and create opportunities for volunteers to help out with tasks in the library and beyond.

Possible Activity 1: Identify areas where volunteers might be used with regards to specific tasks.

Possible Activity 2: Develop ways to show appreciation for volunteers and the work they do for the library.

Stimulates People's Imagination –

Wareham residents like the collection, programming and services provided by the library. Residents stated that they made use of all that the library offered, especially book collections, online resources, children's story times, and adult programs. Residents also shared ideas and suggestions for more programming for all ages as well as expanded collections. Possible focus areas included home schooling resources and an expanded "library of things".

Our activities in this area will continue to ensure that we are responsive to our diverse community and establish collections and programs that truly bring people and ideas together, sparking imaginations and creating meaningful conversations and thoughts.

GOAL 1. Provide access to collections that inspire exploration and broaden horizons.
 Possible Activity 1: Review and update Collection Development Policy.
 Possible Activity 2: Regularly analyze collections and update and/or weed as needed.

GOAL 2. Increase ways for community engagement and involvement.

Possible Activity 1: Evaluate and update online presence.

Possible Activity 2: Increase self-guided activities within the library and out in the local community.

Possible Activity 3: Increase involvement at non-library, community events.

GOAL 3. Provide ways for artists of all types to use the library to display their talents. **Possible Activity 1:** Evaluate and update library art show policy.

Possible Activity 2: Provide space and opportunities for local artists to show their talents.

Possible Activity 3: Outreach with local artists to provide programs, lessons and opportunities to teach others their craft.

Possible Activity 4: Devise ways to increase breadth and diversity of programming for all residents.

Creates Young Readers –

We are a place that believes in encouraging children of all ages to become lifelong readers and learners.

The residents of Wareham value the educational, cultural, and social opportunities the library provides to children of all ages. Whether delivered through story hours, special programming, and/or the collection itself, children's services was listed as a singular priority for many.

Our activities in this area will continue to build on the progress made since the pandemic in increasing the opportunities provided to the young people of Wareham.

GOAL 1. We will work to provide opportunities for community programs/outreach to reach children and teens of all ages.

Possible Activity 1: Work to develop partnerships with local and regional organizations, such as the Zeiterion Theater for co-branded classes, to provide programming.
Possible Activity 2: Seek out volunteers to run programs for older children and teens such as open mic/music programs that appeal to a broad range of participants.

GOAL 2. We will evaluate current programming to provide more diverse and "Out of the Box" events & classes.

Possible Activity 1: Provide more opportunities for family programming throughout the year.

Possible Activity 2: Implement a 1,000 books before kindergarten program at the library to promote reading in young children.

GOAL 3. Establish a priority for engaging more teen/tween volunteers and programs to serve this particular population in town.

Possible Activity 1: Establish a Teen Advisory Group, working with established teen groups (such as the Honor Society).

Possible Activity 2: Host more teen/tween programs such as a game day and/or Lego building challenge.

Connects Residents to the World -

We are a place that links our residents, either in person or online, to the greater world beyond.

Technology continues to change at a rapid pace and Wareham residents make use of the online resources available at the library. Whether provided through equipment, technology classes or general online resources, access to the online world was mentioned frequently.

Activities in this area will ensure that the library is able to strengthen our online presence through the website, social media venues, and other methods. They will also ensure that the library is able to offer a variety of programs and services, not only within the physical library building, but also online which will allow residents to be a part of the greater global community.

GOAL 1. Library staff will review current technology and evaluate patron needs.

Possible Activity 1: Update public computers to current standards.

Possible Activity 2: Install new technologies, such as wireless printing, that have been requested by patrons.

GOAL 2. We will work with other town departments and outside groups to increase our ability to connect users with the technology needed.

Possible Activity 1: Work with the Town's IT Department to develop a library technology plan.

Possible Activity 2: Seek out groups and organizations for potential sponsorship and/or technology programs for the public.

GOAL 3. We will seek out new ways to promote library resources and events.

Possible Activity 1: Staff will investigate and evaluate new and emerging technologies. **Possible Activity 2:** Staff will make use of social media and other online methods for promoting the library and its resources.

Possible Activity 3: Develop a monthly electronic newsletter for announcing library events and programs.
