The process included a multi-pronged approach to assess the current state of the Library and gather community and stakeholder input. This approach involved the development of a board committee, a steering committee, a community survey, a staff survey, a series of interviews with local leaders and community members, a board session, and community focus groups.

Following the input and gathering phase, an initial plan was developed. This plan underwent numerous revisions with further input, resulting in a three-year plan approved by the Library Board this past August.
